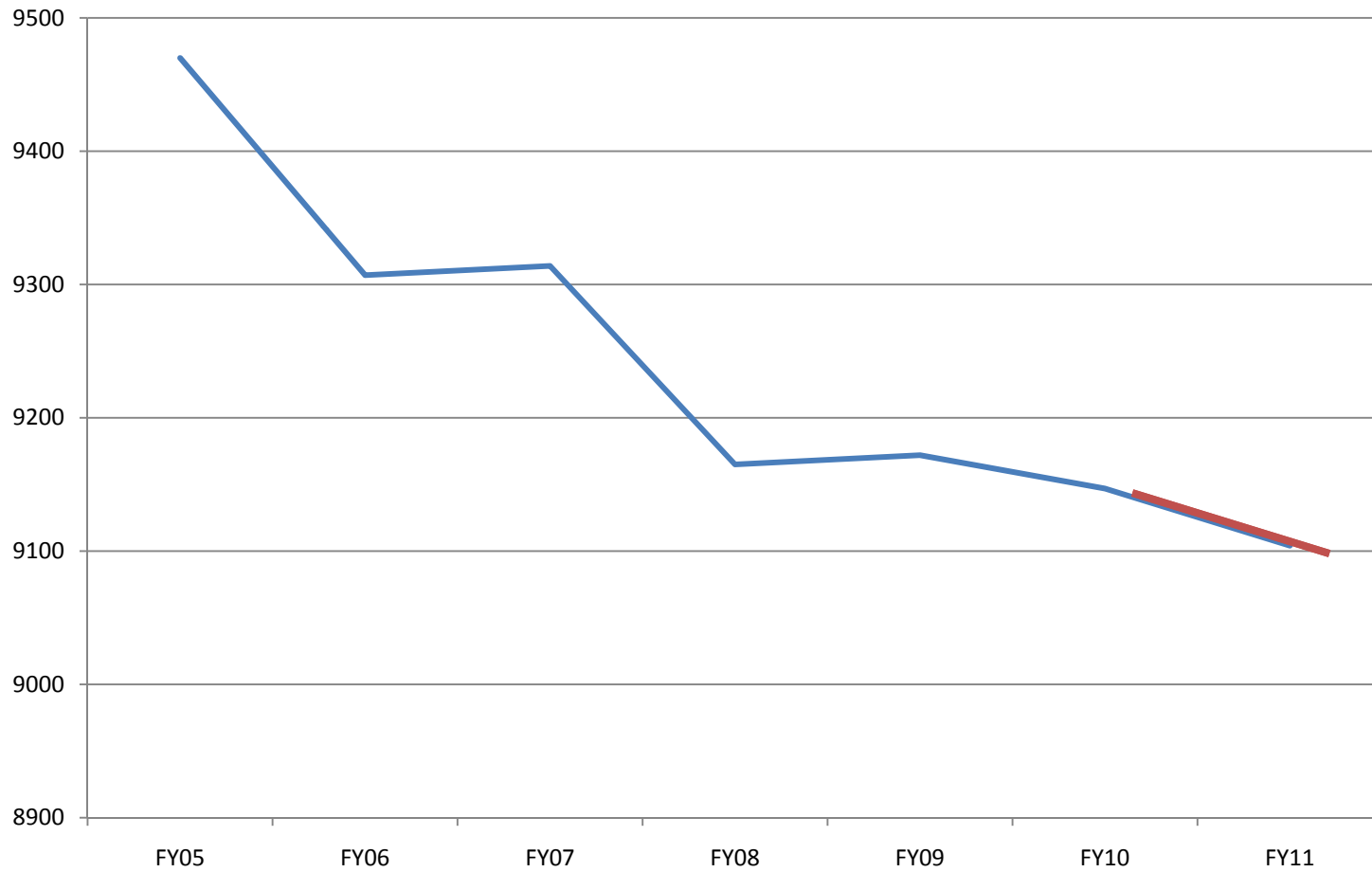

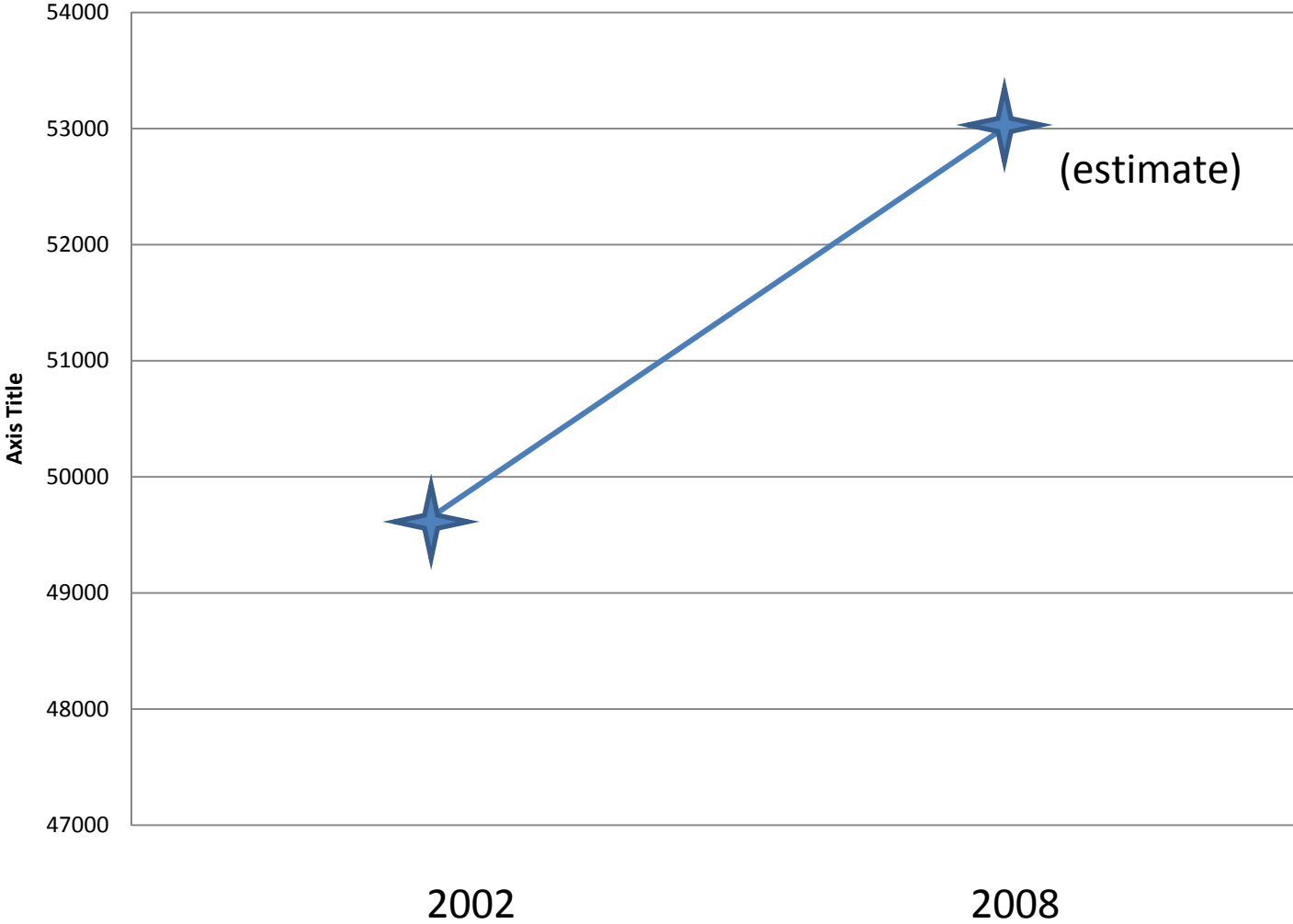

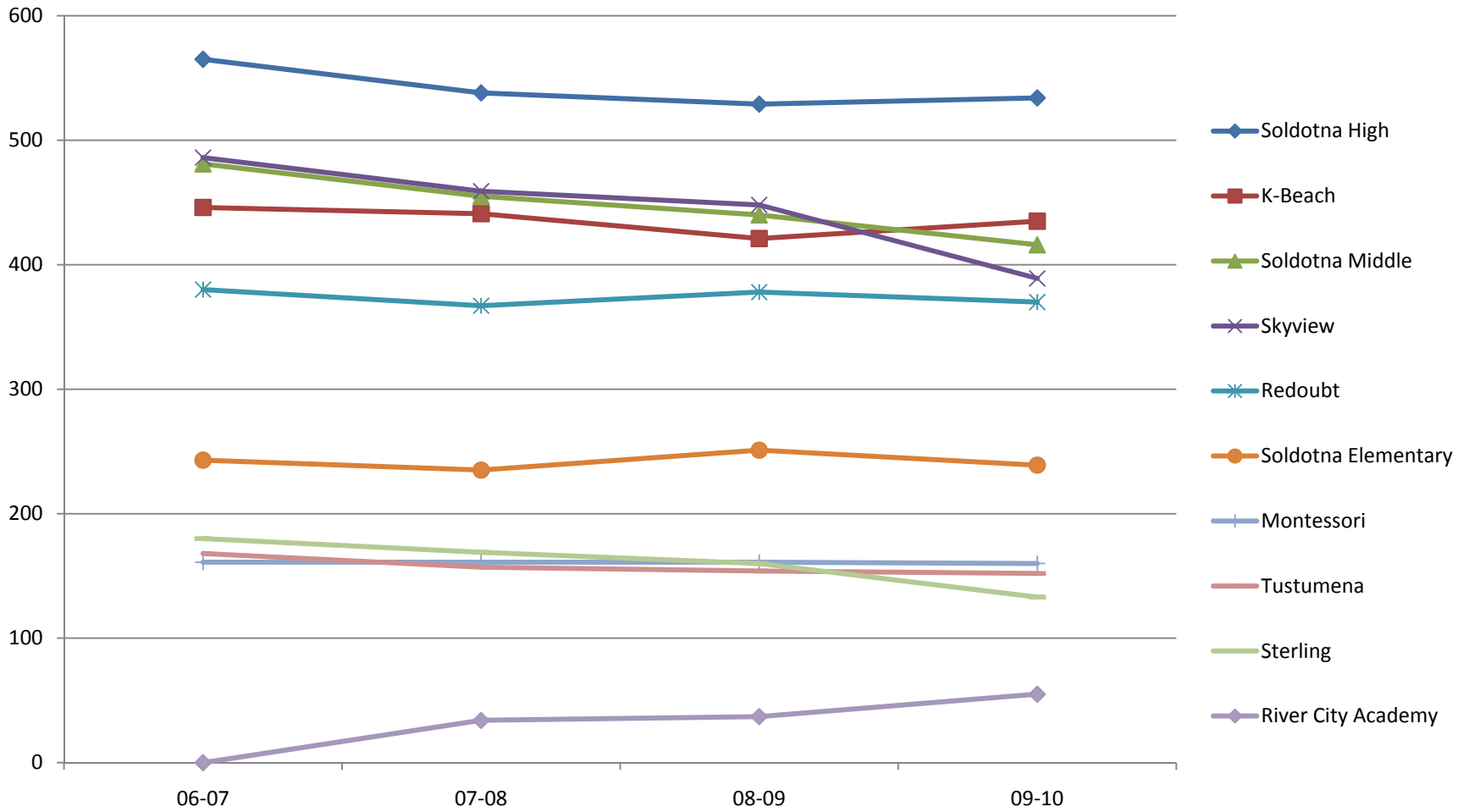
KPBSD's Enrollment Trend 2005-2011 (projected)



Kenai Peninsula Borough's Population



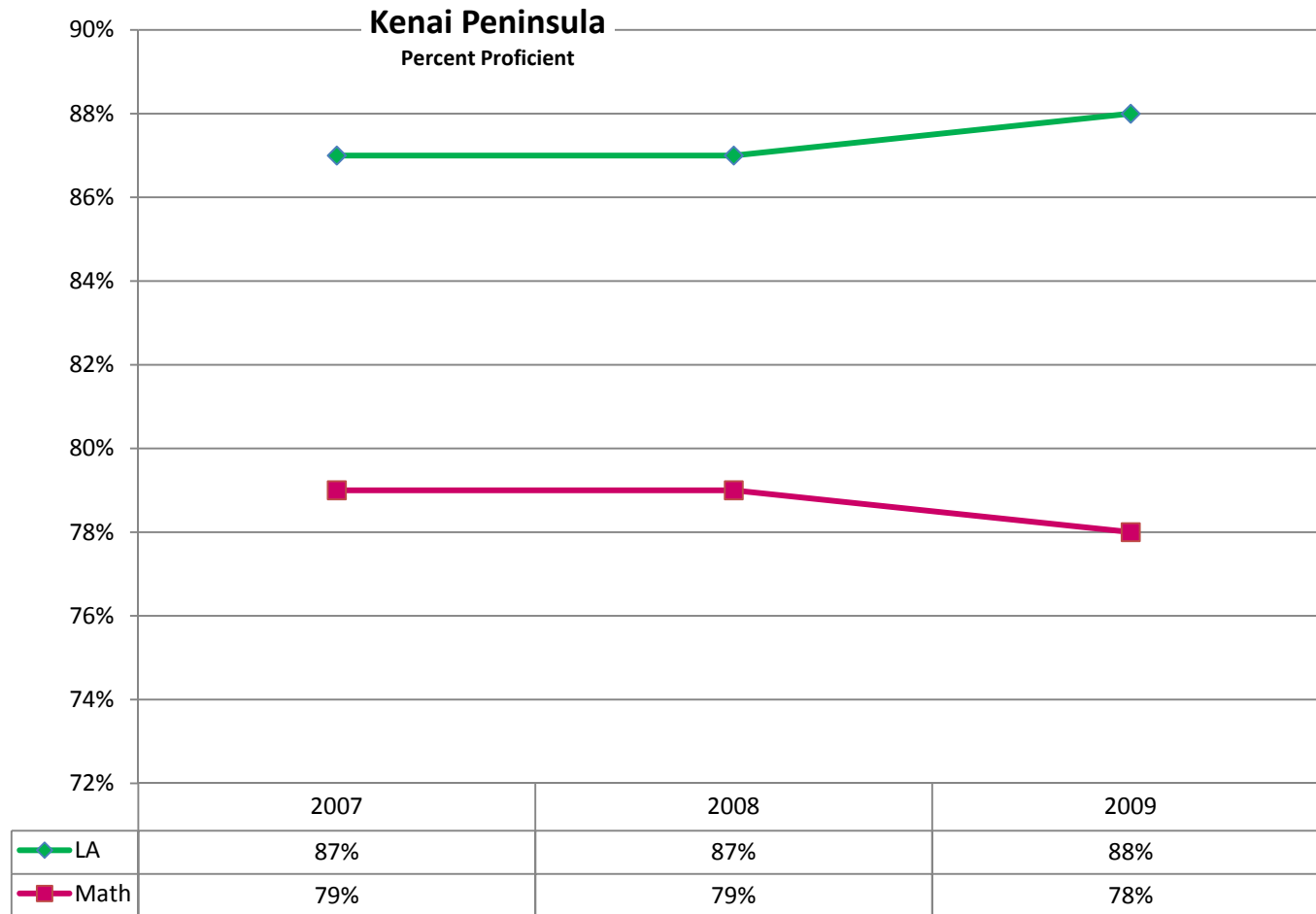

Increase the level of collaboration among teachers, principals and classified staff

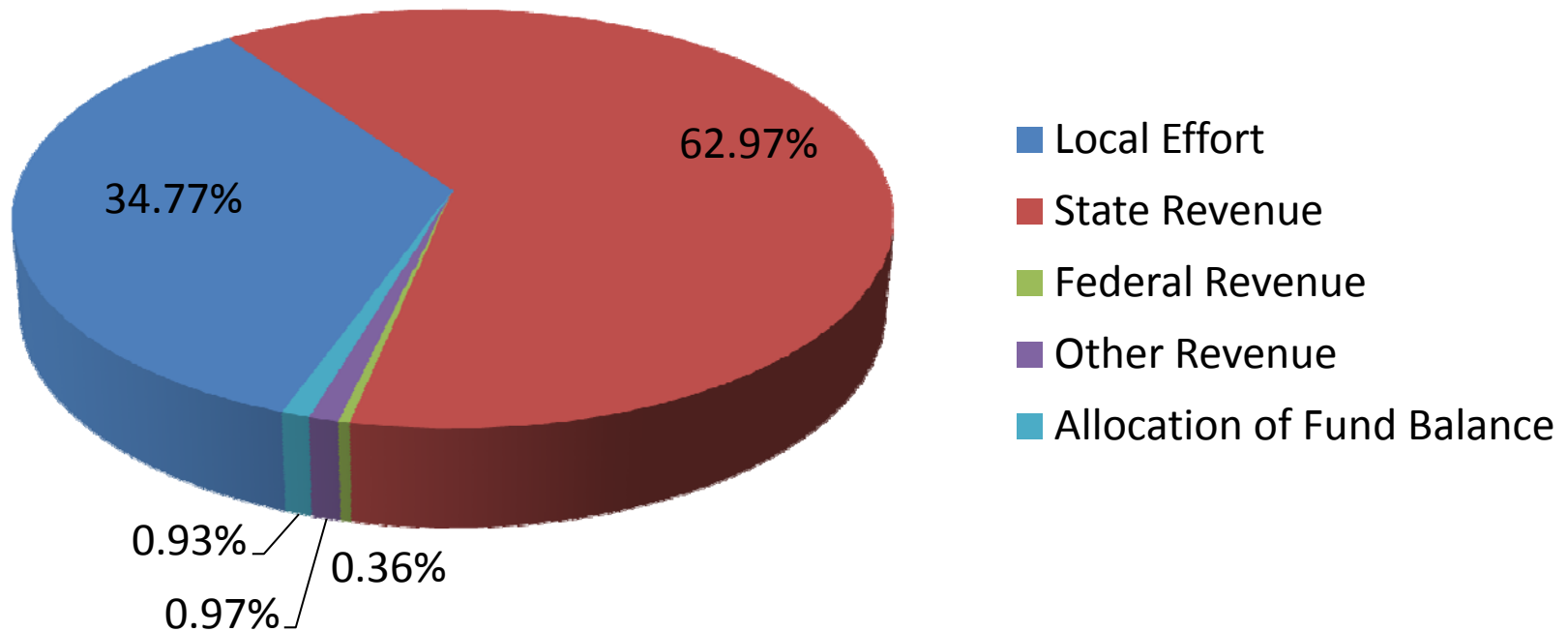
Improve the efficiency of the District's operation through the use of quality processes

Improve student learning opportunities through the use of technology

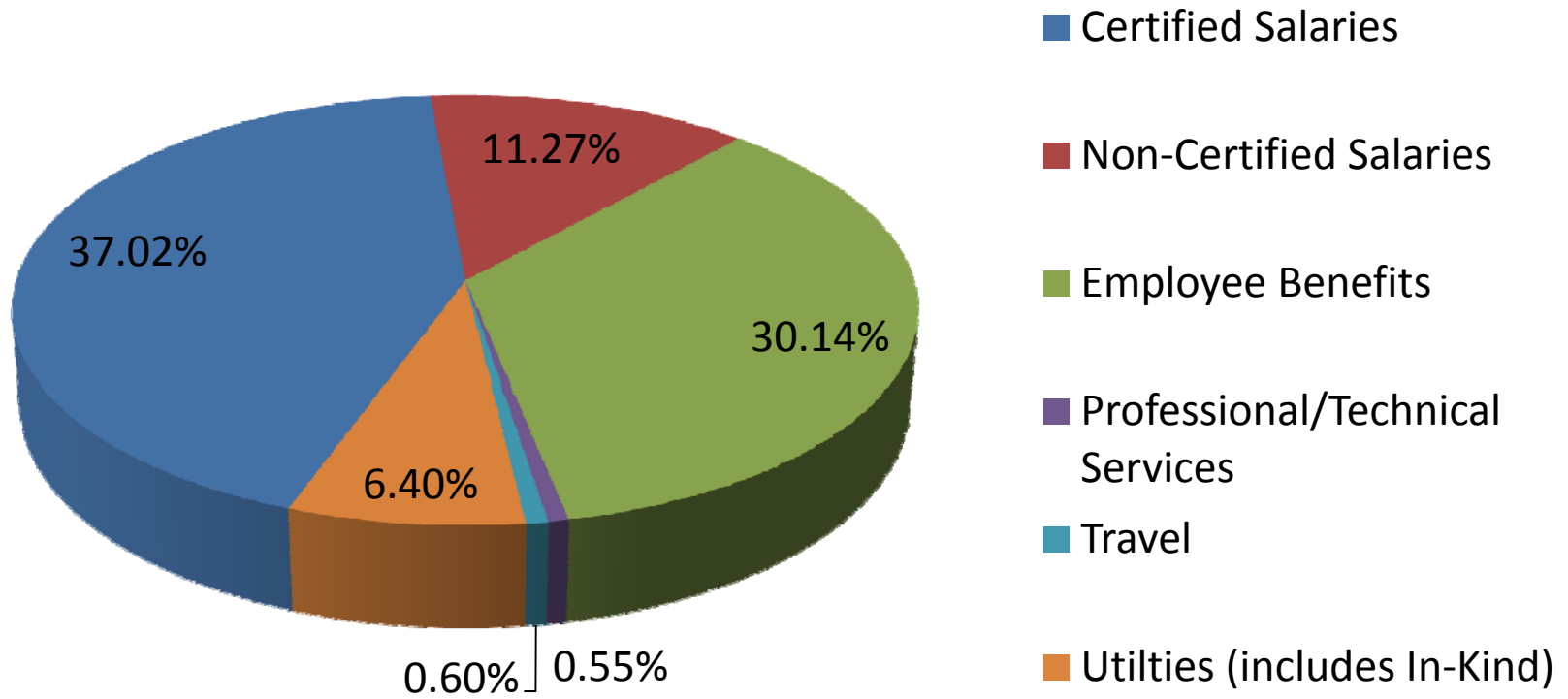
Big picture how to improve a relatively high performing district

- Efficacy

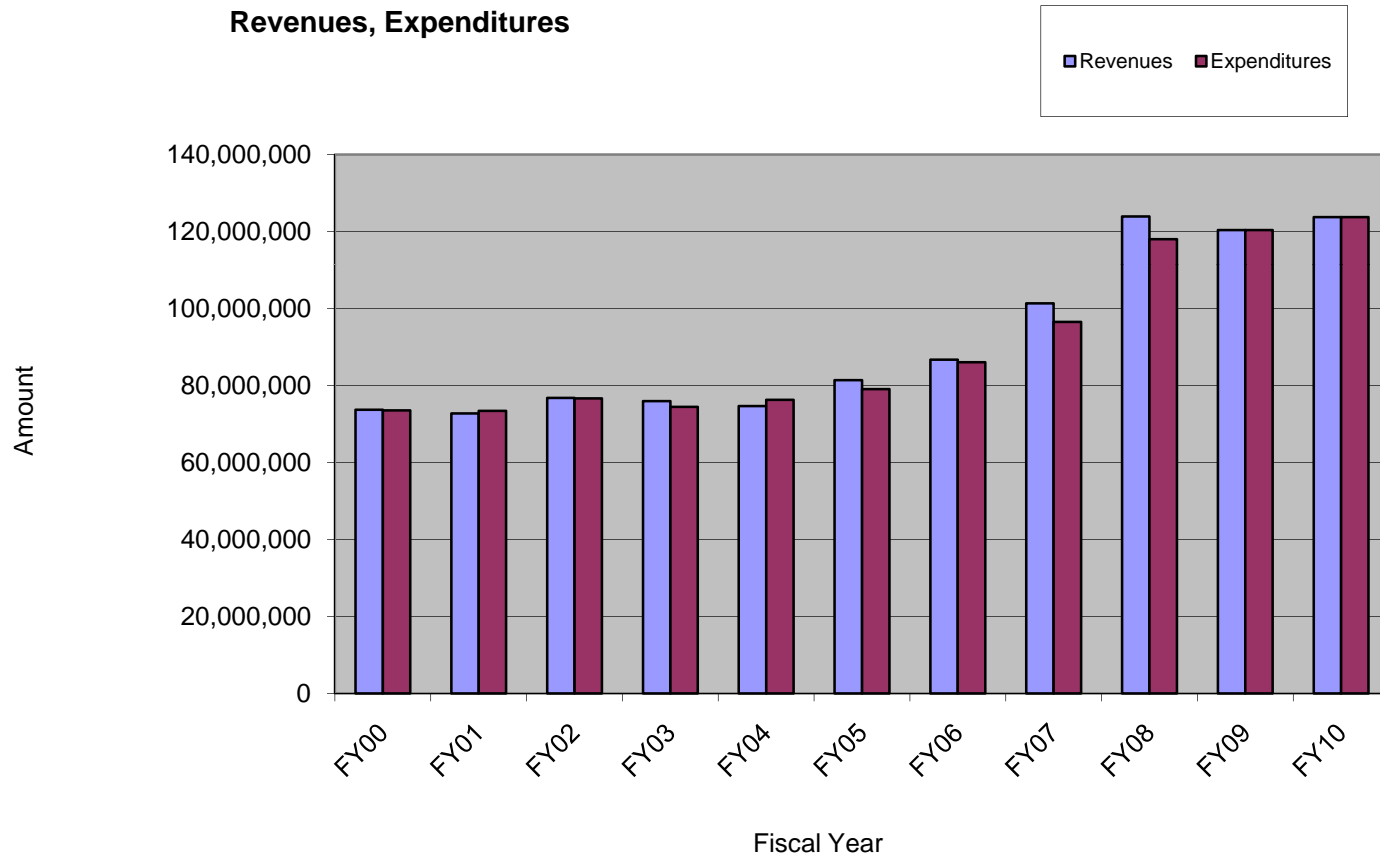
Fiscal Year 2010 General Budgeted Revenue
