Objective:

Task force will review whether it is appropriate for the District to write and then adopt a policy that would guide drug testing of students who participate in co-curricular activities. The task force will make a recommendation for the Board to consider.

Data:

- Review of March 30, 2010 memo from Steve Atwater to the School Board.
- KPBSD Discipline Data for all students does not have activity students pulled out or KPSAA discipline that did not result I school discipline in the discipline database.
- Questions:
 - Why are 11/12 student offense numbers lower than 7-10 grade students?
 - Would this program include middle school students?
 - How many offenders in the data are repeat offenders?
 - How many of those students were involved in activities?
 - Is there a difference between males and females?
- Discussion: What programs are co-curricular and subject to testing.
- Data Review – TAD Reporting
 - Discussion of accuracy re reporting.
 - Ketchikan and Juneau numbers – How many were caught through drug test program? Did number change after implementation?
- Community Action Coalition for Prevention Data Review, page 7, Substance Use
 - Small number of participants
 - Positive participation survey
- What pieces of data do we need to make a data driven decision?
 - ATOSS
 - Possible Police visit next meeting

- Email Sean if other data ideas come up
- Review case law from ACLU
 - Is there compelling evidence that there is a problem and risk to the user group?
- Discussion regarding are we able to justify a problem and is that problem with the athletes? Or extra curricular students?
- Discussion of prevention efforts needed with or without policy.
- Discussion – Do not want to lose kids, want to keep them involved, want to help kids.
- Review Data KPBSD Discipline: males vs females on alcohol and drug violations. More male drug violations than female; similar for alcohol between male and female.
- Discussion on Dr. Atwater’s memo with pros and cons.
- Discussion of ability to beat drug test.
- Discussion of reliability of drug test (false positive rate?).
- Discussion of how test is administered.
- Discussion of program enhancement for education and prevention of drug/alcohol use.
