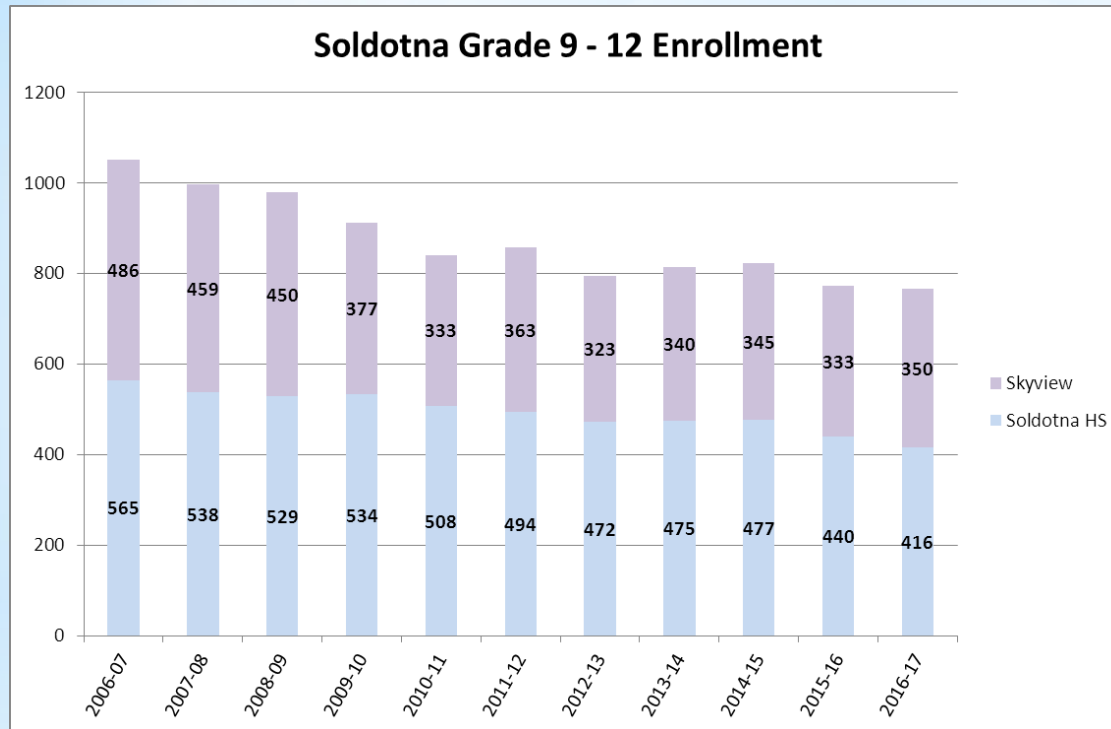
*** Conducted survey to gain feedback from community on next steps (September 2012)**

*** Why are we having these conversations?**

- * Approximately 66% agreed to support changing current configurations but asked for more information. (1,067 parents, students, and employees started the survey; 989 completed the survey.)
- * Several options and school configurations were considered by ten principals and District administration
- * Focus groups—elementary teachers and community leaders, parents—met with the ten school principals and District administration
- * Strong support for moving forward from both focus groups

* A critical element is projected enrollment



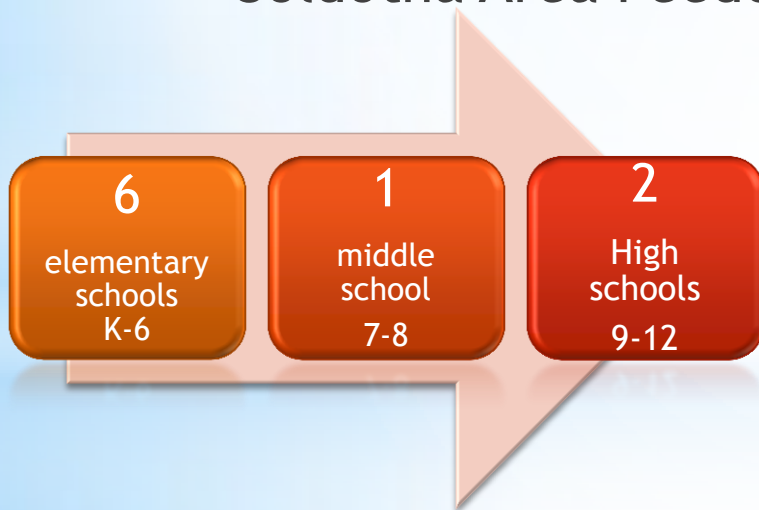

* Why do things need to change?

- * January 10 - conducted focus groups to provide information and receive feedback from other sources - Elementary teacher representatives and Community members
- * February 11 - conducted 2nd round of Community meetings at all of the Soldotna area schools

Transparency

* “There are lots of things to like about this plan. I like the opportunities it can provide students in the classroom. The ‘flow’ of students to a single high school offers improved community relationships rather than pressing students to choose between two high schools. “Bringing the Community” together to offer the best possible educational experience for our students:

- * Two 7-9 grade middle schools with 9th grade house (300 students each)**
- * One 10-12 grade high school (600 students)**

***The Vision**

- * **Implement two 7-9 grade schools**

- * Approximately 300 students at each school
- * Each school fed by 3 elementary schools

- * **Implement one 10-12 grade high school**

- * Approximately 600 students at this school
- * Fed by the two new 7-9 grade schools

- * Original recommended implementation date: Fall of 2015
- * Focus Group asked: *why not move up to Fall 2014?*

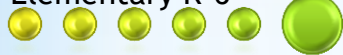

*10-12 High School

- Personalization opportunities - in depth pathway development
- Enhanced blended learning
- Wider variety of course offering
- Piloting opportunities for district-wide implementation

*7-9 Junior High Schools

- Natural feeder to provide smaller community setting
- Enhanced exploratory options based on collaborative scheduling
- Advanced opportunities for 7th and 8th grade students
- Transitions kept to a minimum
- 9th grade options

*What are the possibilities?

- *Current programs

- Overall, current numbers indicate similar amount of opportunities will be available

- *Future programs

- Sports opportunities will be enhanced for the most part
 - Academic opportunities will be created in areas lost by declining enrollment

- *9th grade participation with high school activities

*Activities

- * Task Force

- Responsible for working on social/emotional aspects of a possible change - Culture, mascots, colors, etc.

- * Transition work group

- Responsible for working on pathways, exploratory opportunities and refining instructional delivery model

- * Administrative work group

- Responsible for transportation, scheduling, staffing and input on instructional delivery system

- * **April 1, 2013:** school board work session (to answer Board questions from March 4). In order for the various groups to get started, we will request School Board action at the regular meeting.
