 - c. Support of culture and language opportunities.
 - d. ANSAEP Middle School Academy had 48 middle school students qualify and complete. Additionally, 24 of these students applied on their own for the summer program.
- 5) Setting Priorities for FY16
 - a. Continue academic tutoring based on prioritized need and previous successes.
 - b. Continue and expand KPNYL opportunities and maintain partnership with Project Grad
 - c. Continue support of ANSEP academy opportunity and look for ways to expand.
 - d. Administrator tasked as Native Coordinator with focus on managing the Title VII grant, searching out and writing competitive grant opportunities, and increasing coordination with Native entities especially targeting culture and language opportunities.
