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District Goal Summary: Progress being made, goal not yet achieved.

District Goal Summary Reflection/Response: 73.6% of students earned 6 or more credits during the 2016-17 school year. In spite of not meeting this goal we did significantly reduce the number of students who are far behind track to graduate (earned 4 or less credits) to less than 10 % of students and at the same time had 34 % of our students earn more than 6 credits. We need to continue to find ways to get to 9.9% of students with one F to regain that credit. All these students have been referred to summer school with 15 of 19 confirming they will attend at this time. We anticipate that after summer school we will reach the goal of 80% earning 6 or more credits.
