Current Reality: Nikolaevsk is a K-12 school. Due to enrollment numbers we will be losing one FTE teaching position for the 2016/17 school year. Continuing to offer varied courses to all levels of learners in all areas of interest becomes increasingly more challenging. Nikolaevsk School graduation rate is 100%. This year one student will be graduating a year early and one will be graduating a semester early. Five out of nine graduating seniors (2016) qualified for APS. Three of four Juniors are on track to receive APS upon graduation in May 2017. 100% of our 2015/16 freshmen earned 6 or more credits. At the beginning of the school year one teacher was using Canvas.

SMART Goal: By May 24, 2017, we will increase the percent of students reporting engagement in Blended Learning opportunities to 100% as evidenced by student survey results in November, February and May.

District Goal Summary Reflection/Response: Our goal originally focused on "blended learning". We changed the focus of this goal to personalized or individualized learning to better insure we were meeting the needs of all students. Based on feedback from our Teacher, Student, and Parent surveys, perceptions of these groups are that Nikolaevsk teachers are personalizing learning for the students with most respondents marking 3s and 4s (1-4 scale, 1=never, 4=always). By personalizing learning we believe this will increase student engagement and learning.
