Our school is highly innovative, as evidenced by ConnectED, our community service initiative. Sea Week, having local "professors" help with in-service week through a Culture Workshop The steps we need to take to preserve this culture of innovation is to support and encourage self care of teachers, as teaching multi-graded classrooms with a high percentage of students with disabilities and practically all students with low economic status can be challenging.
