This School Report Card presents information about the school's performance for the 2017-2018 school year. The Performance Evaluation for Alaska's Schools (PEAKS) assessment in English Language Arts and Mathematics were given for the first time in spring 2017 to students in grades 3-10 (PEAKS was given to grades 3-9 during the 2017-2018 school year). These two new assessments replaced the former Alaska Measures of Progress (AMP) assessments in English Language Arts and Mathematics. Students in grades 4, 8, and 10 also took the Alaska Science Assessment.

As part of the ongoing implementation of Alaska's Education Challenge, the Department of Education and Early Development (DEED) is working with school districts to support success in every school. Utilizing Alaska's plan for the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) as a strategy for closing our achievement gaps, a new accountability system is being implemented to help celebrate success and identify areas where additional support is needed, with the goal of increasing achievement for all students. The Overall School Index Value is an important piece of this new System for School Success, which provides information about how each school is supporting its students.

For 2017-2018, schools received a System for School Success Report. The one-page System for School Success Report contains general information and school demographics; grade K-6 Full Academic Year (FAY) participation rate, indicators, and the K-6 index value; grade 7-12 FAY participation rate, indicators, and the 7-12 index value; the overall school index value; the school's designation for level of support; and the school index values for the nine different student groups, also known as subgroups.

Parental, Community, or Business Involvement:

Parental, community, or business involvement can occur in many forms and influence schools in different ways. The results of parental, community, or business involvement for the 2017-2018 school year, as identified by the school, are described below.

Soldotna Prep parents and students were surveyed on attitudes towards parent conferences, communication, grading practices, and school climate. Common feedback continues to be that arena style parent conferences were preferred by parents and were perceived as effective. That being stated verbal feedback from parents who were offered scheduled private conferences was positive as well indicating that different styles of conferences and suit differing demographics within our school. Parents shared that Soldotna Prep overall communicated well with families and that bi-weekly school announcements and quarterly newsletters received via e-mail were appreciated. Reflecting on comments reveals that Soldotna Prep needs to have a greater presence on social media sites as many parents indicated they would prefer that source of communication over e-mail or direct phone calls or voice mails. Parents and students shared no concerns with grading practices and only comment was received feeling the amount of homework being assigned was "overly -burdensome". It should be noted that minimal complaints or negative comment were seen that felt Math courses were too rigorous for their students. This area of improvement should be noted and commended. Student comments reflect that teachers are perceived to be generally welcoming and fair. They reported that the felt safe at school and that administration was approachable and helpful yet needed to be more open to hearing students ideas. They expressed less sadness that they were not "in high school" by being segregated from older students than previous years and the majority continue to report liking school and feeling that it was a positive influence in their lives. There were more students who felt like school was not providing learning opportunities relevant to their interests. Hopefully this can be addressed in the future as we move to personalized learning model.
