




# Total Number of Seward Area Students Enrolled on November 30



## Percent of KPBSD Students Qualifying for Free or Reduced Lunch (Dec. 2010)







# So what are we doing to improve student learning?


- Curriculum audit performed last spring- 3 main findings
  - Internal controls over curriculum and instruction are inconsistent and in many cases absent
  - District does not adequately disaggregate its data
  - Level of financial analysis to drive budgeting is not where it can be
- - Tight- central design principles
  - Loose-expected accommodations at local level, pedagogy is locally determined
  - Tight-stated goals and desired outcomes

# **Funding Conversation**

- State calculates a minimum and maximum amount (the cap) of local contribution
- The cap is relatively abstract to local residents-no tie to local reality
- District is proposing that borough contribute all sales tax and a requested number of mils of property tax.
- For example 2.5 mils to schools, \$200,000 house= \$500 to schools
- District would like to know amount of local funding earlier
- Budget meeting in Soldotna March 1 (SoHi Library)
