### Other Considerations

- Governor has said that he will not increase funding of education for next year.
- Borough contribution is an unknown-likely will increase a little
- Concern with facility maintenance complicates this
- General sentiment that education is not benefitting from the extra funds

### Promoting our Value-having effective conversations

- Three things to establish the conversation
  - Think about it and talk about what you believe and why you believe it
  - Learn to use language that reframes the challenges and issues of public schools
  - Connect your community to your students using stories that bridge the gaps between social groups

### Think about it and talk about what you believe and why you believe it

What do you believe? Does every child deserve a quality education? Do SBA scores define a school? Should schools teach children to think?

Recommendations for effective conversations

- 1. Start with the heart-get the conversation clear on your end
- 2. Keep an eye on the conversation-respond quickly when it turns unhealthy
- 3. Make it safe-move toward safer ground when you are headed in the wrong direction-think mutual purpose and mutual respect

### Learn to use language that reframes the challenges and issues of public schools

- "Godless government schools staffed with selfish union employees."
- Public schools welcome all children into their classrooms
- America's schools feed countless students breakfast and lunch
- Children from dysfunctional homes find safety and support at schools
- Don't just negate the other person's claimsreframe it-common sense is reasoning within a commonplace: accepted frame
- Tell a story to build your frame-have several stories to draw from

## Connect your community to your students using stories that bridge the gaps between social groups

A well told story provides concrete and vivid detail.

Two types to consider

- Challenge plot stories (David and Goliath) will motivate and inspire us. Let folks know that your teachers are leaping tall buildings in a single bound to help needy students.
- Connection plot stories (Good Samaritan, The Blind Side). Use to bridge gaps-social connection = mutuality folks share with students, teachers buying own supplies

### Look for opportunities to promote your school

- Look for opportunities to promote your school
- When you encounter those whom are skeptical of what we do at KPBSD, take some time to speak with them
- Community members must feel comfortable and confident that their taxes are well used by the school district

### Expectation - Effective Leadership

- Creative tension-asking your staff to stretch is your job. Asking them to stretch so that they break is a mistake.
- Effective leadership = taking a risk-what risk are you taking with leading your school? Your job is not to play it safe.
- Look for those teachers who will help you find footing with change.

### Vision and School Identity

- What makes your school different from the others?
  - Your school should have a vision of what it wants to be-this is part of the what makes you different or special
- What can your staff point to that is "their own?"
- Your vision need not be extraordinary
- Leadership Team's vision is to be a high functioning collaborative team
