
KPBSD will increase student achievement by being responsive to individual student needs through structured collaborative practices

So What Can Our Parent Group Do With Data?

- Understand what the results mean, what is a good score?
- Making AYP- what does this mean? Is it bad to not make AYP?
- What is a confidence interval? Spring Creek made AYP
- Graduation rate is increasing this year from 55% to 85%
- AMO increases from 77% to 83% in language arts and in math 66% to 74.5 %

Cyber Bullying

National statistics

- 58% of kids admit someone has said mean or hurtful things to them online
- 53% of kids admit having said something mean or hurtful things to another online
- 42% of kids have been bullied while online

KPBSD Committee is exploring a variety of programsrecommendation to address this issue in a few weeks. Curriculum will be in place for second semester.

Frameworks Teacher Evaluation System

- Old system (checklist) rarely led to improvement
- New system requires a more extensive dialogue between principal and teacher
- Frameworks is not a "gotcha" tool
- □ Frameworks is more comprehensive
 - 4 domains- planning and preparation, classroom environment, instruction and professional responsibilities
- Pilot this year, if all goes well, will recommend to board for adoption in spring.

Curriculum Audit

- Thorough examination of our district through the lens of curriculum
- Creates a baseline for our improvement efforts
- Deficit model methodology- no pats on the back
- Found that there is not enough cohesion between schoolsstudents' experience is overly dependent on the individual.
- There is a lack of quality control by the district over what gets taught and determining whether it is learned.
- Lack of assessment information- how do you know?
- Issue of equity
- District is working to adopt some of the audit's recommendations

Employer Summit

- Once out of school, are our students ready for what is next?
- What can we do differently to better prepare our students for life after high school?
- 3 recommendations
 - Teach the soft employability skills
 - Do a better job with transitions
 - Do a better job coordinating school-business partnerships

Finances


- Borough did not fund district to cap for this year
- Area cost differential will increase for two more years
- Rolling forward existing level of service will cause budget to increase (health insurance and salary increases are the main reason for this)
- Necessary to use savings to maintain level of service
- District is proposing to work more closely with assembly to avoid the end of year struggle

Budgeting

- Your role in the District's budgeting process

 - Attend budget meetings
