Legislative Overview

Things to remember

- election year
- capital budget is likely to **not** be lean, there may be more \$ than expected at the end of the session
- emails and phone calls to legislators have an impact

Legislative Priorities

- Create a new three-year education funding plan.
- Accept the ISER Cost Differential Study for future state education funding.
- Maintain fiscal support for the debt reimbursement program.
- Increase the mandatory age of attendance to 18.
- Establish a new exam to determine student readiness to graduate from high school. Such an exam should replace both the current HSGQE and the soon to be required WorkKeys test

KPBSD's FY11 Budget

- Introduced to School Board on February 1
- We are budgeting an amount to roll forward existing level of service
- This is the last year of the 3-year funding cycle from the state
- Area Cost Differential increases by 12.5% each year
- March 1 budget in detail to Board, March 2 meeting in Homer, March 3 in Seward

- Lots of good examples of using these tools in the District (Seward HS)

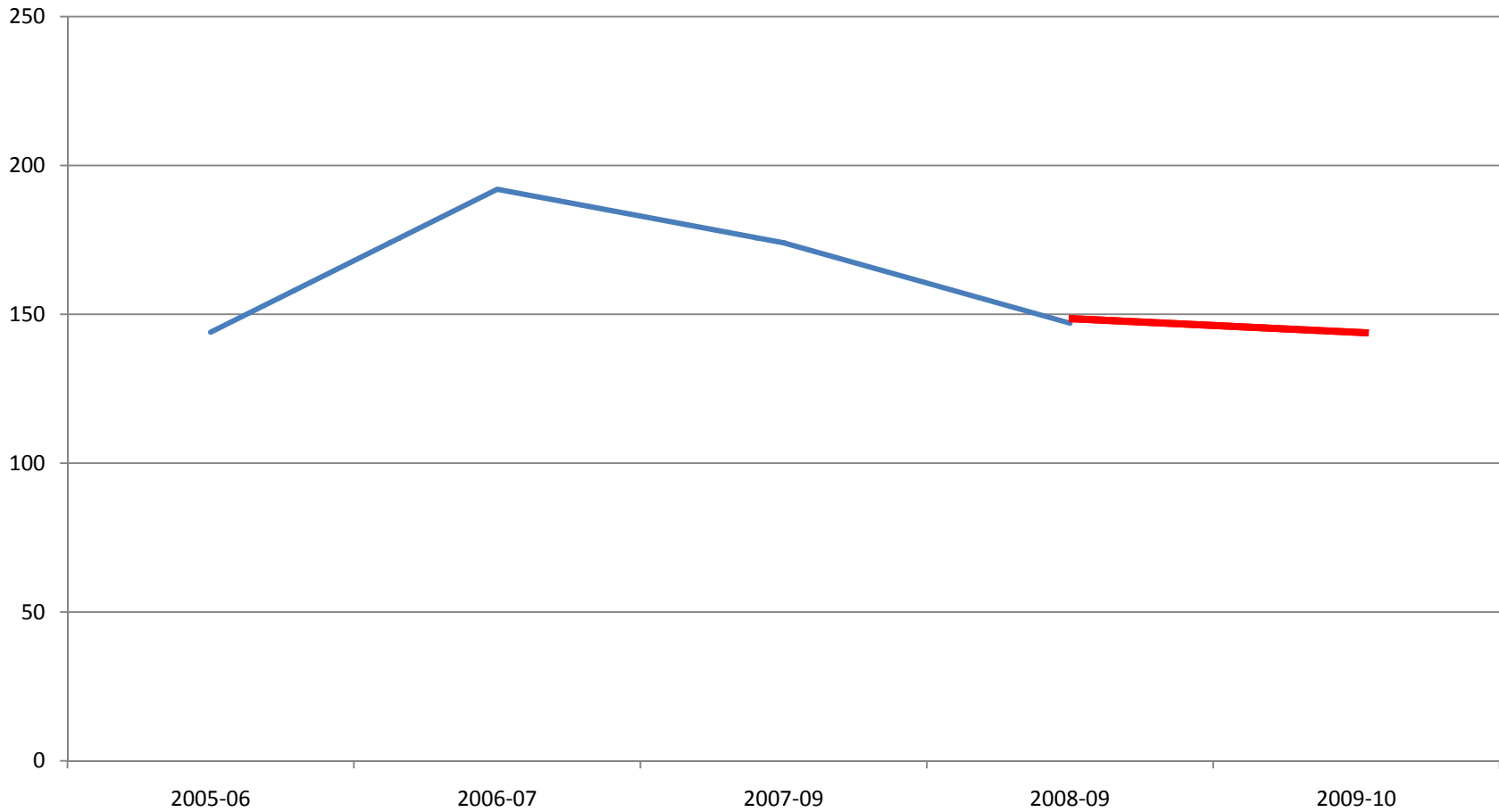

- Audit team will visit most schools and classrooms
- Looking for fidelity of implementation of curriculum-the what
- Looking at how administration supports curriculum
- Looking at our budgeting-are we supporting what we state that we are supposed to be doing?
- Audit does not look at instructional strategies
- Auditors here week of April 19
- Report will point out areas that need to improve
