III. Workforce Development Programs

- a. Youth First Academies (Loretta Spalding): Loretta discussed areas that the Youth First Grant had provided, including: 1) The use of the AKCIS program, 2) WorkKeys administration, 3) Pathway development, 4) Field trips to AVTEC and Anchorage, 5) proving the stipend and supplies for the ETT, PCA, CTSO advisors, Externship participants and the summer work coop coordinator. Additionally Career Guides have been instrumental in planning and participating in the Hospital Career Day and Alaska Construction Career Day.
- b. Construction Academies and participating schools (Dan): Dan provided an end-of-the year report for all of the 18 academies, including: Kenai, Homer, Nanwalek, Nikiski, Ninilchik, Seldovia, Seward, Skyview, Soldotna and Voznesenka.
- c. Carl Perkins (Dan): Dan summarized what was accomplished with Carl Perkins funding. Some of the highlights were: 1) The updating of over 30 CTE Programs of Study, 2) engineering/drafting software/equipment updates, 3) CTSO funding for District and State events, 4) counseling meeting to promote and implement PLCP's and CTE programs, 5) updating of CTE 5-year plan, 6) supplies and equipment upgrades for the health/human/transportation/business/construction/manufacturing pathways and 7) professional development/training funding for CTE teachers.

IV: SB84 update (John O'Brien): John summarized/highlighted what has been accomplished this year using SB84 funding, including: 1) middle school funding for welding, robotics, capital improvement to facilities and equipment. 2) The expansion of fractional staffing for CTE offerings for culinary arts, dental assisting, welding,

criminal justice and marine technology. 3) The funding of a district wide career counselor and career guides to focus on PLCP's for every 7-12 grader, WorkKeys assistance and career counseling. 4) FY14 goals of continued funding of career counselor/guides, engineering academies, drafting classes, fractional staffing, support staffing at the building level and K-12 CTE academies, and 5) continue support of equipment and supply needs for CTE classes.
