Debbie Michael said there was the possibility Greatland Adventure Academy Charter School could rent facilities in the Super Structures Building. All utilities would be included in the rent. A floor plan is being drafted for consideration.

Sunni Hilts stated that the recommendation of the superintendent should be forwarded to the Board for approval.
