Approximately 76% of all graduates, district wide, enroll in post-secondary education or training.

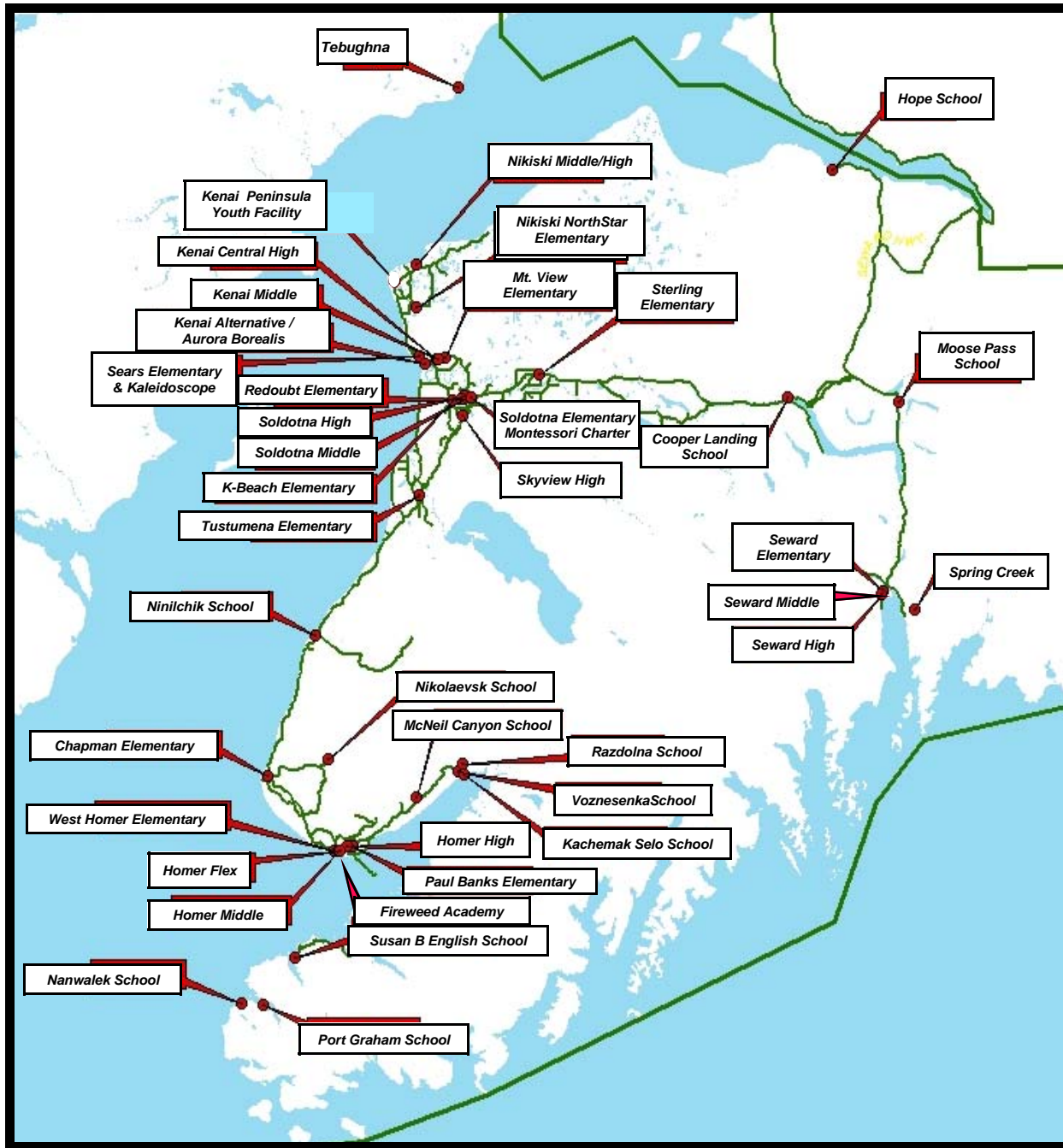
