We currently have a variety of measures and assessments. These assessments are somewhat patchwork in nature and there are no longitudinal assessments. We see adequate measures as a major school need. We currently use station rotations and develop stations that enable students to choose their own depth of activity, this is not entirely universal. We could improve this by adopting a schoolwide model. This year we've increased the level of physical activity that all students get each day by 15 minutes leading to an aditional 1.25 hours weekly of physical activity. By encouraging and providing the opportunity to be physically active, we are contributing to students overall health. We host schoolwide activities that engage parents and connect students with community members and programs. We encourage student involvement in lesson design to nurture academic intrgue and provide the opportunity for students to connect previously acquired knowledge with new concepts and insights. This year, our school is implenting three family movie nights, a collaborative community school carnival, a soup luncheon, and various muscial and sport programs. We strive to continue to create opportunities for families to engage in the educational day through experientional learning, volunteerism, and utilizing technology for better communication.	Advancing

The school leadership meets and forms schoolwide expectations for all students in order to create a positive, predictable, and emotionally safe school climate. Teachers have proposed three recent programs that became a reality this year. The first is homework help time afterschool, the second is an engineering club, and the third is a restructured IN classroom that incorporates cooking and other lfe skills.	Developing
