Furthermore, we have Professional Staff Development, such as our recent Text Dependent Analysis led by Cynthia McKibben, and Reading Fluency for K-2 led by Erin Stevens. Upcoming Professional Development also includes SEL led by Debra Evenson and Family Engagement led by Dr. Ermold. With the knowledge gained from our PD's, we plan to increase rigor in our classrooms even more.
