Four of the district's schools are accessible only by water or air; one by hiking or all-terrain vehicle. A total of 2,827 students are transported 7,725 miles, daily, on school buses.

Dear Interested parties,

The Kenai Peninsula Borough School District encourages public participation in its process to select a new superintendent of schools. The KPBSD Board of Education accepted the resignation of Dr. Donna Peterson at its Feb. 2 meeting, and is beginning a procedure for naming the next superintendent.

The school board invites input from anyone interested in schools, including parents, Site Councils, PTAs, volunteers, business and community organizations that partner with schools, community groups and the general public. The school board has sole responsibility for the selection of candidates, final interviews and selection of the superintendent, but would like to consider the views and interests of the public to help guide those decisions.

Starting Feb. 5, a forum for community input is available on the district's Web site, www.kpbsd.k12.ak.us. Visit the home page and follow the link to the superintendent search page. Once there, you will be asked to rank the attributes you would most like the next superintendent to exemplify, for example: experience and knowledge of Alaska, communication skills and ability to work collaboratively.

The form also includes a comment section, where people may submit other information, thoughts and priorities to help inform the school board's decisions.

KPBSD is a large, diverse district, and the school board hopes to receive input from all facets of it in choosing the person who will be responsible for leading the district, from urban areas to rural, small schools to large, cities on the road system to across-the-bay communities, Native and Russian Old Believer villages, and everything in between.

Once the school board has selected candidates, public interviews will be held and people attending the interviews will have another opportunity to provide written comment on their preferences.
