Doug Grzybowski noted that the CEF funds have actually become more stable as they are now a part of the State's Operating Budget which should help assure continued funding of these programs.

CEF wanted an after school academy success story. A student from Homer attended a welding academy and was hired by the instructor who owned a local business. The student has continued to work for the company and is very successful. Both the employer and the student say the after school academies provide a great link between employers and students.
