Re: The Changing Dynamics of Special Education in the KPBSD

Special education demographics for the KPBSD have changed in the past 10 years resulting in changes to staffing and professional development. Significant increases have occurred with the number of students identified as being eligible for special education services in the areas of Autism and Other Health Impairments. Conversely, there has been a decrease in the number of students identified with Specific Learning Disabilities. Additionally, during these last 10 years, the KPBSD has also had a significant increase in the number of students identified as having "Intensive Needs."


In order to meet the needs of this changing student population, the KPBSD has added a total of ten additional Intensive Needs Classrooms and three primary behavior classrooms in the past six years. To date, with the exception of one staff member, all staffing has taken place by reallocation of existing staff, and from both regular and ARRA grant sources. Additionally, the Pupil Services Department has allocated significant resources into professional development specific to working with students with significant needs.


2001-2010 Trends in Total Enrollment versus Students with IEPs




2001-2010 Trends in Total Enrollment versus Students with IEPs











Emotional Disturbance 2001-2010





Hearing Impaired 2001-2010





Cognitive Impairment 2001-2010





Multiple Disabilities 2001-2010





Orthopedic Impairments 2001-2010





Other Health Impairments 2001-2010





Specific Learning Disabilities 2001-2010


