Mrs. Bennett took the headaches inherent in activities scheduling and had her husband, Tom Bennett, build a program to make the complex task easier. She puts her own education to work by tutoring students, from those needing the most assistance all the way to the highest-achieving kids studying AP chemistry and calculus.

"Robin also seems to take a special interest in lending a helping hand to students who need an adult to guide them," Mr. O'Brein said.

Best of all, Mrs. Bennett does everything she does for the benefit of all kids.

"Robin is genuinely interested in a great educational experience for all students and comes to all school-related meetings to add support and offer suggestions for the betterment of the school and the district. She is not boisterous or pushy. She listens quietly and thinks methodically before adding comment. When she does speak, she is very much respected so everyone listens," Mr. O'Brien said.
