Soldotna, March 22, 2013—KPBSD and the Department of Labor and Workforce Development (DOLWD) are working with students to teach resume writing, completing an application, online applications, interviewing skills, work ethics discussion, and employer expectations.

On March 27, students from Kenai Alternative School, Kenai Central High School, Nikiski Middle-High School, Skyview High School, and Soldotna High School will attend the Peninsula Job Fair from 10:00—4:00, located at the Peninsula Job Center in Kenai, Alaska, in the space adjacent to the Job Center. More than sixty employers will be present to speak to job seekers about their current and future job openings.
