RE: Hope School

I have attached several worksheets to this memo for your review. The worksheets include information relevant to the possible closure of Hope School that I plan to present in Hope Wednesday night.

Page one summarizes the students that were enrolled at Hope School during the twenty day count period in October. As you can see, we started the count well in excess of the required ten students. Unfortunately we had four students leave Hope School after the first week of the count period, which resulted in an average daily membership of only nine students for the count period.

Page two summarizes the Hope School financial related information for FY 07/08. Alaska Statute 14.17.450 (b) states "If the ADM in a school is less than 10, those students shall be included in the ASM of the school in that district with the lowest ADM as determined by the most recent student count data for that district." This means that the 9 Hope students are added to the 11.25 Cooper Landing students, and the net result is an approximate basic need increase of only \$2,845. The FY 07/08 General Fund Building Budget for Hope School is \$234,126 which results in a deficit of <\$231,281> for the building. I am currently trying to determine the amount spent for Borough Maintenance and District-Wide support which will increase the actual deficit related to Hope school for the 07/08 school year.

I think page three contains the most interesting information to me when we look at the actual number of school age children in the community. We currently have eight students enrolled in Hope School, but there are another eight students enrolled in correspondence programs outside of Hope School. There are also currently four non-school age children living in Hope.

Page four looks at projecting Hope School enrollment for the 08/09 school year. With one senior graduating, we have seven students currently enrolled to move forward to next year. This means that we would need an additional three students to reach ten and be funded as a separate site.

Page five is meant to look at economic factors that could possibly result in additional student in Hope. The community of Hope has created a Community Economic Development Committee that is currently working on multiple ideas to enhance the local economy and attract new community members and students. The Borough is also planning a land sale in Hope that could possibly result in additional students.

Page six is meant to look at what would need to be done and considered if there were not enough students to keep the Hope School open in future years.

At 7:00 PM on Wednesday night, January 9, 2008, I will be meeting with Hope community members to present and discuss the above information. It is my intention to try and work with community members to find a way to have ten students enrolled at Hope School for the 08/09 school year.

I will report on the Hope meeting at the School Board Meeting on January 14, 2008.
